The Mission of the Naples Music Club is to support music education and performance, to provide scholarships, and to engage in collaborative outreach efforts within Naples and its neighboring communities.

Program Awards

The Haegg Award – The Haegg award was created in 2009 in memory of Margaret “Peg” Haegg by her husband Henry Haegg and her children. It provides the winner with a private teacher for a period of one year. An essay, letters of recommendation, and an audition are required by eligible students who have never had private music lessons. This award has a strong needs-based component.

Naples Opera Society Award – This award is funded by the Naples Opera Society to recognize the talent of outstanding singers and to stimulate their continued interest in singing.

Bert G. Phillips Award – This annual award is funded by the Classic Chamber Concerts. It honors Bert Phillips, an outstanding cellist who contributed as a teacher and a performer in Naples and throughout the world. He was co-founder of the Classic Chamber Concert series as well as the Luzerne Music Center. The award is made to the first place winner in either the junior or senior string competition.

Clifford L. Saby Award – Clifford Saby established the Clifford L. Saby Scholarship Fund in 1996 to provide scholarships for Collier County youth. His gifts enabled the Club to augment its scholarship awards and support the purchase of musical instruments in the public schools.

Turiel Award – This award was established in 1995 by Mr. & Mrs. Samuel Turiel, in memory of their son, Daniel, clarinetist, composer and conductor. It is presented to a 12th grader based upon competition score, music achievement, scholastic grade point average, an essay, a personal interview, and a recital performance.

Phyllis S. Warren Piano Award – This award honors the memory of Phyllis Warren who co-chaired the Scholarship Competition for ten years and was a founding member of the Crescendos piano group. The award is made to the first place senior piano winner. It was established by her children, Richard Warren and Priscilla Grannis.

Outreach Programs

The Naples Music Club has greatly expanded its role in sponsoring outreach programs, all of which have a strong needs-based component.

Naples Music Club Sponsored:

Middle School Band and Orchestra Master Classes

Second and third year middle-school students who have never studied privately are nominated by their school music teacher to participate in five, ninety-minute lessons. These small group lessons (3-6 students) are taught by professional musicians. Forty-four young people benefitted from these lessons this year.

Haegg Program

Eight students selected for the Haegg Encouragement Award received private lessons this year. All progressed significantly and many achieved musical honors. The early impact of this program has been exciting.

Class Piano Lessons

After school small group piano lessons are provided to students at Golden Terrace Elementary School, Bonita Springs Middle School and, recently, Avalon Elementary School. Thirty-six students are currently enrolled. The teachers have been very positive about the impact, and one school decided to include piano study in their normal curriculum.

The Naples Music Club supports the following programs in collaboration with other organizations:

Pre-K Violin Literacy Program

Ninety four-year-old children receive literacy-based violin lessons twice a week at the Guadaloupe Early Childhood Center. The children are taught by FGCU Bower School of Music majors. The program was also introduced this year at Avalon Elementary and Golden Terrace Elementary (36 students in each program). The children benefit from the development of aural, pre-reading and fine motor skills, improved memory and self-discipline.

Mariachi Program – Pinecrest Elementary School

Thirty third through fifth graders are learning violin and guitar. The program is part of the Miracle Plus after school program. The children are taught by FGCU Bower School of Music majors.

Naples Music Club History

The Naples Music Club was founded in 1965 by Tom and Grace Truesdale. Monthly musical programs were presented as a public service beginning in 1966, the year the Club originated a 90-minute radio program of classical music broadcast over radio station WNFM. During the ensuing years, the Club presented a series of musical programs, led a successful effort to enlarge the string curriculum in the public schools in 1979-80 and in 1993, and worked to improve the performance skills of Immokalee music students beginning in 1999.

Over the years, the most well known of its programs, however, and a key part of its mission, has been its prestigious Scholarship Program. The program began in 1970 with one small grant awarded to a Collier County student, Anita Boqvist, for summer study. Since then, contributions from our generous community have made it possible to support almost 800 of the area's middle and high school students with over \$500,000 in scholarship aid.

A desire to promote and support performance opportunities, informally and in concert, led to the creation of performance groups in 1979. There are now two piano performance groups and two chamber music performance groups who get together once a month to share music and fellowship. One outgrowth of this program is Music a la Carte, a program established in 2009, in which members of the Club and some of the scholarship recipients give recitals in private homes to raise money for the organization. Opportunities for students to gain self-confidence, to practice good performance habits, and to enhance their listening skills were also created in 2008 when an organized program of student recitals was initiated.

An area of major expansion for the Club occurred in 2010 when a commitment was made enabling students with significant financial needs to achieve the benefits of musical education. The first initiatives were to support a pre-K literacy program that utilized the violin and a Mariachi program that had already been established in Immokalee, and to assume responsibility for a Middle School Master Class Program for small group instruction. The vision of Past President Karen Marcotte and the generosity of the Haegg family had already led to the funding of private lessons for students who had never studied privately – a program that is very synergistic with the
